**Staff Presentation and Information**

1. Expenditure Report Update

David Miranda shared an overview of the Measure G Expenditure Report. The Tustin High School Science Building remains on budget with a total projected cost of \$11.8 million. The Tustin High School quad project was completed at an approximate cost of \$4.3 million. There was a modest increase of \$26,000 due in part to unforeseen conditions, a need for additional testing/inspections, and the purchase of a new sound system for the quad. Staff noted that the report would be shared one last time at the next Committee meeting to reflect the final payout of all retentions.

Mr. Miranda then shared the budget summary and expenditure report for the summer modernization projects at Tustin High. He stated that the budgets reflect expenditures paid through August 24, 2010; however, the work has all been completed with the exception of technology upgrades which were currently in progress.

The Foothill Science addition report was shared for the last time as all contractor retentions have now been released.

2. Update: Tustin High Science Center, New Gymnasium, and Summer Modernization Projects

- Tustin High School Science Center is 60-65% built with completion scheduled for spring 2011. Staff noted that they were in the process of accepting bids for the technology component of the work, and the bid results would be shared at the next Committee meeting.
- Stamped architectural plans have been received from the Division of State Architect for the Tustin High School gymnasium project. The proposed new gymnasium is approximately 29,000 square feet and will be located adjacent to the school's existing gymnasium, between the swimming pool locker facility and stadium bleachers. The design features a lobby, dance room, team rooms, storage, concessions, competition and practice basketball/volleyball courts, bleachers, ticket booths, and restrooms. The cost will be split between Measure G and Measure L funds and the project is slated to break ground in February 2011.
- The summer modernization projects at Tustin High School included a complete remodel of the special education and math buildings, as well as, replacement of the HVAC in building 230. The projects were a major undertaking as the project team was limited to the summer timeframe to start and complete the scope of work. The summer projects are essentially complete with costs coming in slightly under the projected budget.
